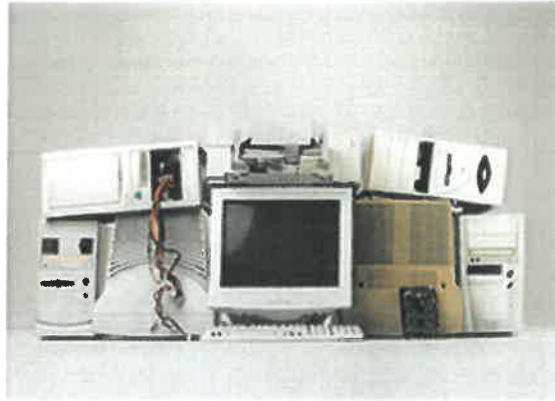


Town of East Greenwich ELECTRONIC WASTE DROP OFF EVENT

Items accepted at NO charge: Computers, laptops, monitors, routers, PDA's, cell phones, mice, keyboards, ink-jet printers, toner cartridges, CD/DVD players, radios, televisions, network equipment, wires, stereos, speakers, telephones, cameras, microwaves, small household appliances, and acid lead batteries including auto/marine and battery back-ups.

A \$10 disposal fee is charged for each laser-jet printer, air conditioner, dehumidifier, and other coolant containing devices.

Not accepted: Light bulbs, single use batteries, tapes/disks, glass, Styrofoam, broken TV tubes or any hazardous materials.

Indie Cycle, LLC, has a zero landfill policy. We do not remarket any hard drives or data storage devices. All electronic materials are transported to ORS a local, R2 certified recycler for processing.

Eco-Depot (open to RI residents)

Appointments are required for this event. Eco-Depots are free collections for properly disposing of household hazardous waste from RI households. Household hazardous waste is anything labeled with a skull and crossbones, or words like 'toxic', 'poison', 'flammable', 'combustible', etc. Examples include mercury devices, automotive fluids, fertilizers, pesticides, pool chemicals, and polishes.

Appointments are made to prevent everyone from showing up at once, which reduces wait time in line. We try to service 25 cars every 15 minutes—you won't even need to get out of your vehicle!

Shredding Event (open to RI residents)*

Resource Recovery will host a free shredding event during the scheduled Eco-Depot collection. Residents who want to shred sensitive personal (i.e. not from a business) documents can bring up to two, 22-gallon recycling bins' worth—free of charge. As a reminder, a sensitive or confidential document is one that contains a unique, identifying number that can be traced directly to a specific person, and which cannot be found readily through public searches. For example, a person's name and address is not considered sensitive, confidential information.

This special event is available free of charge to Rhode Island residents only. Appointments are not required. **Note: once the shredding truck is full, we cannot accept further material for shredding. For this reason, shredding services are on a first come/first serve basis.**

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE



ECO-DEPOT is a free service for properly disposing of hazardous waste from Rhode Island households. Since 2001, this program has kept millions of pounds of hazardous waste out of Rhode Island's environment.

WHAT IS HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE?

Household hazardous waste (HHW) is anything labeled with a skull & crossbones, or words like "toxic," "poison," "flammable," "combustible," etc. coming from a household. Most homes have a fair number of HHW products stored in the garage, basement, shed, bathroom, and kitchen.

Hazardous substances can easily catch on fire or can react or explode when mixed with other substances. Just as they require special care when you use them, they require special care when you throw them away. Otherwise, you may cause serious injury to yourself, your loved ones, and pets. When you don't dispose of them properly, you could pollute the environment by poisoning the sewer and septic systems, drinking water, groundwater, and the earth.

REDUCE YOUR HHW



One way to reduce your HHW is to switch to green cleaning products. Most everything in your home can be cleaned with a few cheap, safe, and easy-to-use ingredients you can combine yourself, like tap water, baking soda, vinegar, and plant-based liquid soap.

THE USUAL SUSPECTS

The average household stores about **10 gallons** of common hazardous waste. Check the list below to see if you have any of these items in your home:

Antifreeze	Metal polishes
Arts & crafts chemicals	Mothballs
Batteries (rechargeable & long-lasting)	Motor oil & filters
Bug sprays	Muriatic acid
Charcoal lighter fluid	Nail polishes & removers
Compact fluorescent light bulbs	Oven cleaner
Disinfectant	Paints
Drain openers	Paint thinners
Driveway sealer	Pool chemicals
Flea dips, sprays & collars	Propane tanks
Fluorescent light bulbs & lamps	Rug & upholstery cleaners
Gasoline	Sharps/Needles
Household pest & rat poisons	Shoe polish
Houseplant insecticides	Turpentine
Lawn chemicals & fertilizers	Varnishes and stains
Mercury thermostats	Windshield wiper fluid
